



Review Women's 69kg

- For the first time since 2007, multiple women claimed a gold medal in this weight category in a single edition of the world championships, when Liu Chunhong (CHN) won the Snatch and Slivenko collected the Clean & Jerk and Total world titles.
- Never before, three different women claimed a gold medal in this weight category.
- The last women's event with three different world champions in a single weight category was the Women's 58kg in 2014 with Deng Mengrong (CHN) winning the Total, Siripuch Gulnoi (THA) the Clean & Jerk and Sukanya Srisurat (THA) winning the Snatch.
- World Champion in the Total, Leidy Yessenia Solis Arboleda (COL) became the first athlete from South America to reach the world championships podium in this weight category.
- Snatch world champion Romela Begaj (ALB) became Albania's first ever world champion in women's weightlifting and Albania's second athlete to claim a world championships gold medal, after Ymez Pampuri (ALB) who took the Press world title in the men's 60kg in 1972.
- Clean & Jerk world champion Sara Samir Elsayed Mohamed Ahmed (EGY) became the second woman from Egypt to claim a medal in this event after Nahla Ramadan (EGY), who grabbed bronze in the women's 69kg Snatch and Total at the 2002 World Championships.
- Martha Ann Rogers (USA) claimed bronze in the Snatch, Clean & Jerk and Total. She became the first woman from USA to claim a medal since Cheryl Haworth (USA) claimed bronze in 2005 in the +75kg in 2005.
