



Review Women's 59kg

- Kuo Hsing-Chun (TPE) won the women's 59kg Snatch and Total world titles.
- Kuo won her first world title in the Snatch, after winning the Clean & Jerk and the Total in the women's 58kg in both 2013 and in 2017.
- Kuo has now won six world titles, surpassing Chen Shu-Chih (TPE, 4) and Feng-Ying Li (TPE, 5) for second-most among lifters from Chinese Taipei. Only Chen Yui-Lien (TPE, 9) has won more.
- Chen Guiming (CHN) won the world title in the Clean & Jerk, her first medal at the world championships. She previously took three silver medals in the women's 63kg at the 2016 Asian championships.
- Rebeka Koha (LAT) finished third in the Snatch and Total. Last year, she finished third in the Snatch and Total in the women's 58kg.
- Koha has now claimed four podium finishes at the world championships, surpassing Alberts Ozolins (LAT, 2) and Arturs Plesnieks (LAT, 3) for second-most among Latvian weightlifters. Only Viktors Scerbatis (LAT, 12) claimed more podiums.
- Hoang Thi Duyen (VIE) took silver in the Snatch while participating in Group B. She is the third woman from Vietnam to win a medal at the world championships, after Hoai Do Thi Thu and Vuong Thi Huyen.
